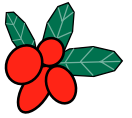
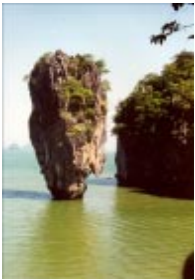




Season's Greetings 2001



DEAR FAMILY AND FRIENDS,



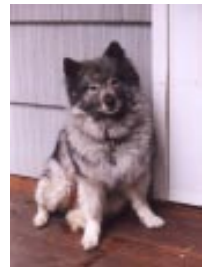
